



Note to Contributors

The *Journal of Contract Law* is intended to provide both a forum and a vehicle for discussion and analysis of the issues which confront contract lawyers. It is not aimed at academic or practising lawyers in particular, the Board welcomes submissions by anyone who has something to contribute to contract learning.

A broad view is taken of the subject matter of the *Journal*. What is usually referred to as the 'general principles' of the law are appropriate, but so too are the so-called 'specific contracts' (sale, hire and so on). It is also appropriate, in the Board's view, to publish articles, comments and notes on other areas, such as restitution and equity, which overlap with basic contract law, at least where there is a genuine connection with contract law.

As far as possible the Board will treat each issue on its merits and maintain an appropriate balance between articles, comments, notes of cases, book reviews and notices. Correspondence on published material will also be considered for publication, at the discretion of the General Editor.

Three issues of the *Journal* will constitute a volume.

It is *Journal* policy to consider only those manuscripts not under consideration by other journals. Those contributions accepted for publication cannot be published elsewhere without the permission of the General Editor.

Manuscripts should be in double spaced type and sent by email. For the guidance of contributors a statement of style may be found on the inside back cover. The General Editor reserves the right to alter grammatical construction, punctuation and citations to conform with the general style of the publication, accepted grammatical rules of construction and gender-neutral language. Each contributor agrees that by submitting a manuscript to LexisNexis Butterworths for publication in this *Journal*, he or she licenses LexisNexis Butterworths to publish the manuscript, altered as indicated above, in this *Journal* and other publications in print and other forms with due attribution.
