Practitioner Books Online vs. eBooks

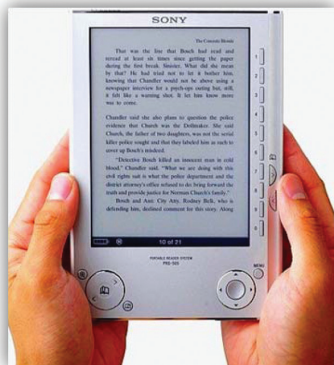

Practitioner Books Online – Available on LexisNexis AU

- Practitioner books online are available to you within your annual LexisNexis AU subscription.
- You can choose to add/renew your subscription to practitioner books online each year. The costs of the subscription are on an annual basis.
- Practitioner books online enable you to give everyone access 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
- Practitioner books online are searchable and easily browsed. Results from the books will show in your LexisNexis AU search results.
- The content hyperlinks to other research solution services within your LexisNexis AU subscription, such as CaseBase and Unreported Judgments.
- With practitioner books online you are able to annotate and download PDFs at chapter level.
- The online content will update with the latest edition of the hard copy title.

What is the difference between eBooks and practitioner books online?

eBooks



- eBooks are downloadable electronic versions of hardcopy practitioner and academic books.
- eBooks will be available for download to the Sony e-reader as well as iPads and laptops.
- Depending on the device, eBooks may have 'flip' technology for page turning.
- eBooks are a one-off purchase. No subscription is needed.
- eBooks will be available for purchase and download from the LexisNexis online bookstore and other websites in the future, like iTunes.
- The purchase price will be similar to the hard-copy book, and each purchase will allow for 1 download, so that the buyer can add the title to their ebook reader, laptop and/or iPad.
- eBooks can be purchased at any point in time, just like traditional hardcopy books.
