➤ 2016 Federal Election – Capital Monitor

The 2016 Federal Election campaign is in full swing leading up to a double dissolution election on Saturday 2 July. In accordance with section 57 of the Constitution, the Governor-General Peter Cosgrove, at the request of the Prime Minister Malcolm Turnbull, dissolved the Senate and the House of Representatives at 9am on 9 May 2016. This dissolution brings to an end all proceedings of the Senate, the House and all Committees.

Unlike the United States, Election campaigns in Australia are relatively short, traditionally occupying about 33 days. A long campaign, such as the one Malcolm Turnbull launched in early May, set to last 58 days in total will no doubt deliver numerous political and public policy announcements from all sides, but will the critical information stand out among the avalanche of

As a result, LexisNexis Legal and Professional in the Pacific region has partnered with WordRake to bring the latter's professional editing software into the recently released Lexis Draft Pro drafting and review software. The integration has already occurred on Lexis Draft Pro in Australia and New Zealand, and the company said it is exploring a similar rollout in the UK, U.S. and Canada where applicable.

Glenn Cooksley, head of drafting at LexisNexis Pacific, told Legaltech News that LexisNexis focused specifically on WordRake to integrate because of the software's ability to build upon analytical software already developed by LexisNexis and Microsoft, as well as the platform's focus on collaboration and clarity.

"WordRake presented a new and high quality editorial function desired to support customers when they want to improve

document readability," Cooksley said. "We particularly saw this as useful when collaboration brings multiple authors together in a document, some with potentially more verbose writing approaches than others. WordRake is especially good at improving the clarity of sentences, and the software makes helpful editing suggestions to the reader."

Of course, WordRake isn't the only collaborative document tool on the market. However, developed by lawyer Gary Kinder, LexisNexis believes the software has a specific focus on features useful to lawyers that makes it a good fit with Lexis Draft Pro.

Cooksley explained, "As legal writing expresses statements often differently than in 'normal' writing, it is important to find a tool that can provide editorial advice to improve the clarity of language in the document, yet not detract from meaning intended by the author. WordRake has the logic that addresses the specific needs of legal writing very effectively."

The Index this year will again celebrate individual innovators, legal firms and in-house legal departments and the innovation they display in the development of their


