





Updates to CaseBase® and LexisNexis® AU

We have recently made some updates to CaseBase and LexisNexis AU to improve your research experience.

New features have been added to CaseBase including:

- **Browse cases by category or keyword** – easily locate multiple cases on a particular area of law, without prior knowledge of the CaseBase taxonomy. Simply browse or search the categories to find cases relevant to your research.
- **Addition of country flags in international CaseBase entries** – quickly distinguish between local and international content on CaseBase. Country flags will appear next to international case entries, making it easier for you to visually filter the results.

Updates have been made to LexisNexis® AU including:

- The search results list will now show extracts by default, without needing to hover over the result.
- The 'go back' on the results page will change to 'Edit search'.
- The error message which appeared when a user tried to edit a saved search in the 'Quickfind search form' will now read 'Searches performed/saved via a Quickfind cannot be edited. You may either Run or Delete them'.
- A few bug fixes have been made and links will be updated.

➤ Halsbury's Laws of Australia

Halsbury's continues to improve its overall currency of 68% post 1 January 2010 with double services during January, March and April. Titles published include [Trade and Commerce](#), [Liquor](#), [Local Government](#), [Practice and Procedure](#), [Corporations](#), [Family Law and Restitution](#).

The [Restitution](#) title has had a major revamp and includes significant changes to Victorian legislation, in particular the migration of previous acts to (VIC) Australian Consumer Law and Fair trading Act 2012. The updated title comprises 570 pages and addresses restitutionary claims based on mistaken payments or compulsion, ineffective contracts, restitutionary claims based on wrongs committed and defences to restitutionary claims. Restitution was updated in Service 364 by highly regarded author, Professor Gino Dal Pont, Faculty of Law, University of Tasmania.

We are excited to announce that service 23 of [Workplace Law – Fair Work](#) published in January with a massive 1300 pages of legislative amendments in the wake of the government's Fair Work regime revisions. The latest service update, in March 2013, consisted of extensive commentary updates to take note of this legislative overhaul, including the changing role of Fair Work Australia to become the Fair Work Commission, and the implications of the legislative changes in areas such as Agreements, Transfer of Business and Termination of Employment.

In May 2013, [The Law of Superannuation in Australia](#) will publish with a new guidecard titled 'Recent Developments'. This guidecard will outline the impending 'Stronger Super' reforms and will be written by new author, Michael Chaaya, a partner at Corrs Chambers Westgarth Lawyers.

➤ Other titles

In response to customer feedback, [Civil Procedure Western Australia](#) has been expanded from a two-volume to a three-volume work. This will provide subscribers with more space and increased usability across all three volumes. Volume Three now contains Related Legislation and Legal Costs (WA) and Federal Legal Costs guidecards.

Furthermore, upon the publication of service 146 of [Carter's Criminal Law of Queensland](#) in May 2013 the core staged changes, which commenced mid-2012, to the 'Summary Offences' material will have reached completion. The 'Summary Offences' topic area now covers liquor, gambling, animal cruelty, invasion of privacy offences and classification of computer games, images, films and publication offences – as well as core topic areas covered in the Summary Offences Act and Domestic Violence legislation.

The upcoming service 231 of [Practice & Procedure High Court & Federal Court of Australia](#) will include all legislative amendments from the Federal Circuit Court of Australia Legislation Amendment Act 2012 and the Federal Circuit Court (Consequential Amendments) Act 2013.

In the latest service of [Patents, Trademarks & Related Rights](#), specialist author Marianne Barker has updated chapters on 'Offences under the Trade Marks Act 1995' and 'Customs Seizure of Imported Goods Infringing Australian Trade Marks' taking into account the raising the bar legislation and regulations.

Furthermore, the latest issue of [Copyright and Designs](#) includes updated commentary by expert authors Dr Kevin Lindgren and Warwick Rothnie on 'What Copyright Protects', 'Who owns Copyright', 'Statutory Defences', 'Copyright Licences', 'Infringement', 'Design Copyright', 'Registration of Designs', 'Rights and Enforcement' guide cards.

In Services 193 and 194 of the [Australian Immigration Law](#), we published two major amendments to the Migration Regulations 1994. The first one, the Migration Legislation Amendment Regulation 2012 No 4 (SLI 238) reduces the number of temporary work visa subclasses by 50 per cent and streamlines the requirements for sponsorship, nomination and visa application and grant and the second amendment, the Migration Legislation Amendment Regulation 2012 No 5 (SLI 256) amends the criterion for the grant of a visa. We have updated the 'How to Use' chapter to ensure it reflects the current length and scope of the work. The 'Bridging Visas' and the 'Visa Application' commentary has been updated throughout to ensure currency and succinctness.

Furthermore, Service 259 of [Australian Family Law](#) includes amendments from the Federal Circuit Court of Australia Legislation Amendment Act 2012, the Federal Circuit Court (Consequential Amendments) Act 2013, and Federal Magistrates Court Legislation Amendment Rules 2013 (No 1).

Reports and Journals

The *Australian Law Reports (ALR)* and *Intellectual Property Reports (IPR)* were recently updated to include the recent case of Google Inc v Australian Competition and Consumer Commission [2013] HCA 1 which covered the liability of search engine for misleading and deceptive sponsored links.

We have also published a bumper issue of the *Australian Journal of Human Rights* with a special section on the International Criminal Court. In addition, the article 'The scope of immunity from seizure and suit for cultural objects on loan in Australia' by Craig Forrest, Reader and Fellow at the Centre for Public, International and Comparative Law, University of Queensland was published in the most recent edition of the Media Arts Law Review.

“ How to increase the relevancy of your index terms ”




When searching on Nexis.com you may want to increase the relevancy of the terms in order to bring back better results.

You can increase the relevancy of your index terms by using the tick box

Relevancy: Major terms only on the power search page.

This will increase the relevancy from 50% to 85% and decrease the amount of non-relevant results.
