Tables were also updated for the Bailment, Damages, Estoppel, and Transport titles. Both services are of high value with a large volume of value added content pages and an improvement in currency bringing the currency span for the content updated in services 390 and 391 from 2009-2012 to 2014.

Double Services are scheduled for the month of July with updates planned for various titles including Aboriginals, Agency, Consumer Protection, Courts, Evidence, Industrial Law, Intellectual Property, Primary Industry, and Taxation and Revenue.

CaseBase remains the most comprehensive citator in the Pacific. In the past year, CaseBase's database has grown from 578,000 case citations to 645,000. That is 67,000 entries in the last 12 months!

The team has been hard at work in 2014 developing and implementing a number of customer-requested enhancements to the product, and you will see the following changes made to the Pacific research platforms.

The catchword clean-up project has seen a review of CaseBase's taxonomic structures with a view to consolidating commonly searched catchword sets into a streamlined index. This will result in more accurate searches for users, as well as significant improvements to the Browse by Category function available to CaseBase AU users.

The CaseBase annotation house style has also been revamped. CaseBase now includes comprehensive annotations of all legislative provisions cited within a judgment regardless of the level of consideration given to them, in order to better aid practitioners in their research.



Accident Compensation Victoria

Accident Compensation Victoria has undergone a significant content restructure. It now contains the full text of the Workplace Injury Rehabilitation and Compensation Act 2013, of which the majority of provisions took effect on 1 July 2014.

For hard copy subscribers, the new Act has been inserted into a new, larger binder alongside the existing legislation. Detailed annotations to the new Act will be added over time. Editorial notes have been provided that direct you to the comparable provisions in the legislation to be superseded, and we will shortly be publishing comparative tables that reflect the differences between the new and old legislation.


