



Note to Contributors

The *Australian Bar Review* is designed to provide a forum both to the academic community and to practitioners. The *Review* seeks to publish articles, notes and comments, and detailed commentaries upon recent cases and legislation in the field of legal doctrine and legal procedure. Articles may deal with a topic in these areas in an analytical, theoretical or empirical fashion. Contributions detailing or analysing the importance of recent developments in legal doctrine and legal procedure, or dealing with issues of policy and reform are also welcomed. This is a refereed journal and the content is controlled by an editorial board following a formal process of peer review.

Although it is intended that the primary focus of the *Review* will be upon Australian law, articles and other contributions on overseas developments will be considered for publication where they are of wide general interest, or of relevance to the Australian situation.

Australian Bar Review will publish generally three times each year, three such issues constituting a volume. Contributions are welcome from members of the judiciary, barristers and solicitors, arbitrators and conciliators, academics and those in related fields. The *Review* will seek to provide space for articles that analyse basic problems of legal doctrine and legal procedure. While the principal point of view expressed will be that of an observer of legal doctrines and procedures as applied by the courts, neither the authors nor the audience will be limited to practising barristers or solicitors. Notes on the appropriate form and style of manuscripts submitted for publication may be found on the inside back cover.

In form, it is proposed that the bulk of each issue contain a number of articles of substantial length. In addition, as occasion demands, shorter notes, comments and reviews of significant books will appear. Letters to the Editor dealing with previously published material or any other relevant topic will be published.

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Contributions that are rejected will be returned to the author, but neither the editors or publisher accept responsibility for loss or damage to any such manuscripts or discs containing contributed material.
