



Note to Contributors

The *Australian Property Law Journal (APLJ)* publishes three issues per volume. Its subject coverage is the law and practice relating to real and personal property and conveyancing, treated under the following broad headings: real property and conveyancing, leases, mortgages, personal property, special types of title relating to land (including strata and cluster titles, or types of titles) and trusts and equity generally (including wills and succession) in relation to these matters.

The format of the *APLJ* includes sections containing articles, case notes, notes of recent legislation, precedent notes and book reviews. The *APLJ* seeks to maintain a balance between matters of national interest and those matters of more interest at a state or territory level. This balance is maintained by the *APLJ* Editorial Board which consists of eminent practising and academic lawyers from all states and territories. This journal follows a formal process of peer review.

Articles from 4000–12,000 words (10–30 pages) are preferred. A style guide appears inside the back cover of this issue.

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
