



Note to Contributors

The *Competition & Consumer Law Journal* is designed to be of service both to practitioners in competition and consumer law and to the academic community.

The *Journal* is controlled by an editorial board, following a formal process of peer review. It seeks to publish articles of the highest standard on all aspects of competition and consumer law including product liability, cartel conduct and misleading conduct. Where appropriate the *Journal* may consider commentary and discussions of important cases and developments, although articles which are merely descriptive will not be considered.

Although the primary focus of the *Journal* will be upon Australian and New Zealand law, contributions on overseas developments having a bearing on Australian competition and consumer law will be considered. Articles from 4000–8000 words are preferred, although longer and shorter articles will be considered.

It is scheduled to publish three issues a year, three such issues constituting a volume. Contributions are sought from members of the judiciary, barristers and solicitors, academics and others who are involved in or who have an interest in competition and consumer law. Notes on the appropriate form and style of manuscripts submitted for publication may be found in the Style Guidelines on the inside back cover of each issue.

Each contributor agrees that upon acceptance of a manuscript by LexisNexis for publication in this *Journal*, he or she licenses LexisNexis to publish the manuscript, altered as indicated above, in this *Journal* and other publications in print and other forms with due attribution.
