

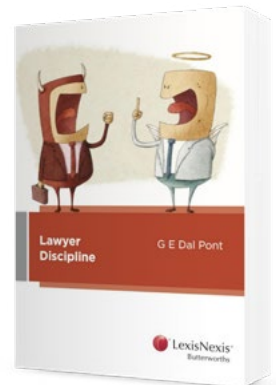

The swelling membership of the legal profession, coupled with progressively wider concepts of misconduct in both practice and non-practice spheres, and greater visibility of disciplinary determinations, have generated a burgeoning jurisprudence on the discipline of lawyers. This book probes this jurisprudence, commencing with a principles-based approach as a prelude to a dedicated treatment of disciplinary procedures. It then elaborates upon how specific forms of misconduct translate into the disciplinary sphere. Its subject matter accordingly targets the boundaries of ethical legal practice, which in turn makes it directly relevant to legal practitioners, regulatory and professional bodies, and disciplinary tribunals.

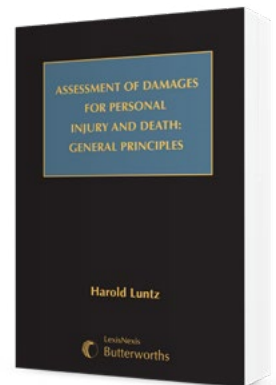


Assessment of Damages for Personal Injury and Death 5th edition

Assessment of Damages for Personal Injury and Death 5th edition is primarily concerned with how an Australian court arrives at the sum of money it will award as damages to the victim of a tort or breach of contract who has suffered damage in the form of personal injury. It also deals with the assessment of the damages payable when death has resulted from such personal injury, and with the few other remaining instances of 'relational' loss, where one person may recover damages for loss he or she has sustained as a result of personal injury suffered by another.

It has also been rearranged to take account of the publication of Professor Pearce's new book **Interpretation Acts in Australia, 2018**. The case law and legislation have been updated to include changes that have occurred since the publication of the last edition in 2014.
